Reading: After Christmas we will be making a few changes to the way we send books home for Parrett, Aller and Sedgemoor pupils. Your child may come home with two books, one which will be phonically decodable and match the phonemes learned in class, the other will be a book which may contain phonemes your child has not met before. We will send more information to parents/carers after Christmas.

We will be asking children who do not have signatures in their planners to join our lunchtime book club so they are not missing out on crucial reading practice. We will be focusing on children who regularly miss reading sessions at home and who would really benefit from reading more regularly.
