

## Home Learning Survey – February 2021

In the interest of ensuring our home learning provision was the best it could be, parents and carers completed an online survey in February 2021.

Percentage of parents and carers who rated our provision as good or excellent:

How would you rate the Learning Packs for the quantity of work?	82%
How would you rate the Learning Packs for the balance of subjects?	82%
How would you rate the Learning Packs for the correct challenge level?	82%
How would you rate the Learning Packs for accessibility?	88%
How many children from your family attend this school usually?	82%
How would you rate the communication and home learning organisation following the announcement about the current lockdown on Monday, 4 January 2021 (pack distribution, Tweets and emails etc)?	90%
How would you rate the communication for arrangements of home learning between 4 January and today, including daily teacher Tweets, website and emails?	82%
How would you rate the support you and your child have received during lockdown from teachers, SENCo, Headteacher, HEPsathome@gmail.com and the School Office?	78%
If you have received vouchers or a hamper during lockdown, how would you rate the service you have received?	100%
If you have requested school places, how would you rate the service you have received?	94%
Overall, all things considered, how have we done?	86%

We received an overwhelming number of positive comments thanking the school for the provision, support and learning resources. Just under 9% of respondents asked for an increased online learning offer. Other comments included:

Q Why some children were permitted in school and not others

A This was a government criteria which was applied as fairly as possible

Q The website links were challenging to type in

A In response to this we produced a WORD document where these could be copied and pasted into browsers

Q A suggestion that drama should be included in the subject offer

A Subjects were rotated and had we been on lockdown longer, drama would have been set

Q The quantity of work was too much

A There was a government requirement for the minimum amount of work set which we adhered to. Discussions with teachers would have guided workload where there was an issue

Q Could we upload content to Facebook

A The content was uploaded to the school website which was accessible to everyone. Important messages were placed on Twitter which can also be viewed on the website front page and on Google. The school does not have a Facebook account.
