Harvest: We are going to be holding a Harvest assembly on Monday 4 October. This year we will be collecting items to donate to the Trussell Trust Food Bank, between now and 4 October. The following is a list of items which are needed at this current time.

Cereal, soup, pasta, rice, tinned tomatoes/ pasta sauce, fruit juice, lentils, beans and pulses, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, tea/coffee, tinned fruit, biscuits, UHT milk, instant mash potato (not everyone has a cooker), toilet rolls, chocolate for Christmas boxes, deodorant, toilet paper, shower gel, shaving gel, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, tooth paste, hand wipes, laundry liquid/powder detergent, washing-up liquid, sanitary towels and tampons, nappies, baby wipes and baby food.
