Remembrance: We will have the British Legion poppies and other items available for everyone to buy from the first day after half term. We will bring these onto the playground in the morning at drop off.

We will be holding our school service on Remembrance Day with the children only. Children of Service personnel have a special role in this commemoration service.

Communication survey: Thank you to everyone who participated in our survey regarding communication. We had 96 responses.

87% of parents are happy with the current way we hold parents' evenings, although 81% would like the option of being able to access parents' evenings online. As a result, we are going to offer both face-to-face and online parent evenings in November so that you can choose the method of communication that suits you. More details to come after half term.

93% of parents found the newsletter easy to read and useful. If you have an issue accessing the newsletter please contact Mrs Soakell in the School Office and she will check the email details we hold for you are current. You can also access it via the website.

60% of parents regularly look at Twitter where photos are posted every day.

83% of parents know who to contact if they have a question about school procedure. If you have a question, please contact Mrs Soakell in the School Office in school hours. Out of hours, our website and newsletter have most of the information you require.

Thank you to everyone who participated: it's great to hear where we are doing well and where we can improve.

House point mufti: Well done to the red team who have won the House Point total this half term for good work and good deeds! Check your child's planner to see which team they are in. The red team can wear mufti on Friday after half term; clothing must be appropriate for the weather.

Safeguarding: The October break is a time when everyone needs to relax after such a long half term. It's a great time to get out and about before the poor weather starts to settle in.
