Parents evening: Please ensure you respond to the survey for parents evenings so we are able to plan how these will happen.

School photos: These will take place for all children on Thursday. The children will be sent home with ordering information on Thursday. Leazemoor children should wear their regular uniform into school and bring in their PE kit.

Morning drop-off: We have reinstated the small playground for Cockle Moor and Haymoor children. This means that for the morning drop-off, children from Y2-Y5 can use the climbing frame.

We would like Cockle Moor and Haymoor children to be dropped off into the small playground before the bell rings so that all parents are standing away from this area when the bell rings. We know that this will help with all children settle into being dropped off and start the day on a more positive note. Although you may be tempted to stay with your child until the bell rings and then bring them over, please avoid this as it makes separation challenging for all children. Arriving at 08:40 and taking them directly into the small playground and then leaving or at least standing back will help everyone.

The Cockle Moor and Haymoor reading trolley will be in place from Monday for parents and carers to change books. Miss Chadbourne will be on hand to support this each morning for the first week. This is also the perfect reason to drop your child in the small playground and then go directly to change books.

School Council: The School Council have decided bake sales are a good way to fundraise for the school library. We would like Leazemoor children to bring in cakes and bakes on Friday for other pupils to buy. These will be sold during breaktimes with Leazemoor pupils managing the stalls. If you would like your child to buy a cake, please send in a maximum of £1 on Friday.
