**Cocklemoor Bake Sale:** We have Cocklemoor's Bake Sale next week on Friday 19 November with fundraising going towards the school library. We kindly ask that Cocklemoor bring in cakes on Friday morning. As we often have children forgetting their money during breaktimes, we are going to sell the cakes on the playground at collection. Thank you for your support with this fundraiser.

**Christmas cards:** We have sent home Christmas cards today which children designed. We need to receive all orders by the end of next Friday in order to receive them in plenty of time for Christmas. The school is undertaking this as a further fundraiser for the School Library.

**Personal Details:** Please ensure the School Office are updated with any new contact details for pupils, parents and other family members on your contact list.

**Visitors:** Our local and named police team visited the school on Wednesday. They toured the school and were welcomed by each class. The police will be on site regularly to work with staff and children. The police may also occasionally be on the playground during drop-off or collection for any questions parents may have.

**Donations:** Cocklemoor classroom is really taking shape as new furniture and resources arrive. One area the children are particularly enjoying is the role play. We are hoping to add to our collection of role play items, and would like to kindly ask if any family would be able to donate any of the following: pots and pans, cooking utensils, small tablecloths, role play kitchen, easel, dress up costumes, padlocks with keys, microphone (and stand), hats, old phones/kettle/technological items that don't work eg laptops, keyboards etc. If you would like to donate any of these items to Cocklemoor class, please pass them to Mrs Brown or Mrs Douglas at drop off or collection. **Safeguarding:** We have been informed by many parents and members of the public that there is a great deal of anti-social behaviour taking place in our community. We would strongly encourage everyone to report all incidents to the police with the names of those who are causing disruption. Unless the police receive reports, and these include names, the perpetrators cannot be supported in the way they need.

Incidents which are in process should be reported by calling 999. Incidents which have already taken place should be reported to 101.
