School Lunches: Please make your menu choices and/or book and pay on WisePay by 09:00am on Tuesday, 5 July 2022 for meals W/C 11 July 2022 (week 2 menu).

As you will undoubtedly know, food prices have risen considerably over recent months and are predicted to sustain this increase. This means that unfortunately we will need to raise the cost of our school lunches to £2.65 per meal from 1 September 2022.

SchoolComms: We are currently undertaking SchoolComms training so we are able to have a smooth transition from WisePay before the end of the term. All meals will be uploaded to the new system for the new year with parents sent details of how to access them over the next week.

Visits: We have had another successful educational visit today to Carymoor Environmental Trust. These visits can only go ahead with volunteers supporting them. A huge thank you for this and to those parents who volunteer for swimming too.

Premises: We have been successful in a government bid for a new boiler. The current boiler relies on one of us regularly restarting it when it blows out on days when the wind is in a certain direction! Work will start on this over the next few weeks so most maintenance can take place over the summer holiday.

Transition/Move-up Day: The children will be taught by their new Teachers on Thursday but not necessarily in their September classrooms.

New Reception children should arrive at 08:40 for the morning and dropped off in the small playground. New Year 1 children (current Cockle Moor) should also be dropped off in the small playground as usual.

New Year 2 (current Haymoor), new Year 3 (current Leazemoor), new Year 4 (current Perrymoore), new Year 5 (current Portmoor) and new Year 6 (current Saltmoor) should play on the main playground until the bell rings. These children should then join their line in front of their September Teacher. Please note that new Year 6 children will not enter by the front door. New Year 7 will be attending the Academy; parents and carers will have received information directly from the school.

PE next week: Please take a careful look at the first page of this newsletter as many PE days have changed due to Move-up Day. They will return to normal the following week.

Early Birds & Busy Bees: Due to higher costs, we will be increasing charges for Busy Bees and Early Birds from September. The new charges are as follows per hour:

First child: £3:50 Second child: £3.00 Third child : £2.50 Fourth child: £2.00 Pupil Premium: £2:00

Whilst we understand that we are all occasionally held up, we kindly ask that parents arrive at Busy Bees no later than 17:25. Any additional time after 17:30 is charged at £10 per 10 minutes on the first occasion. If this takes place again within 12 months, places are withdrawn for 12 months from childcare facilities.

Tesco: The Tesco blue counter box is now open. Please choose the HEPS library box for your blue counter. We can be awarded up to £1500 towards the library costs if we are the most chosen community project.

Safeguarding: Thank you to the parents who challenged trespassers on the field this week. If this or anything similar happens again, please ensure you keep yourself safe whilst dialling 999 to report it.

Question on the gate: *"What do I need to do if my child is leaving HEPS over the summer?"*

"Please talk to us as soon as possible so we can help with the moving process. We understand that parents don't move their child/children without a very good reason, often for job opportunities or a house move. We like to know for several reasons. We can support your child emotionally and help you co-ordinate with a new school to ensure a smooth transition. Sometimes parents might suggest that their child doesn't tell anyone; this rarely works!

As we have waiting lists in many year groups, letting us know helps us ensure another child can start at HEPS at the beginning of the school year. Please don't hesitate to speak with me or send an email to the Office if your child is moving over the summer."
