School Lunches: Please make your menu choices and/or book and pay on Schoolcomms by 09:00am on Tuesday, 19 September 2023 for meals W/C 25 September 2023 (week 1 menu). You do not need to select a pudding when ordering a packed lunch.

Cocklemoor and Haymoor: We kindly ask parents and carers of Haymoor and Cocklemoor children to only bring book bags to school unless it is the day for PE. We don't have the storage space for rucksacks and other types of bags and it makes it very time consuming for staff to sort out reading books. We would prefer our staff spend time with the children. Thank you for your understanding.

Harvest: Our Harvest Festival was so successful last year in showcasing a variety of heritage bread we would like to do something similar this year. We are holding our Harvest assembly on Wednesday 27 October.

We would like to ask for different types of bread to be brought in from home which represent the different cultures and backgrounds of our children. Additionally this year we would like some jams, chutneys or spreads which are favourites in your household. As this was so well supported last year, and we are hoping it will be the same this year, please send in small quantities of any bread or spread tasters. We would also like to ask for any specialist breads which are supportive of children with various intolerances. We will display these during the assembly to highlight how fortunate we are to have a great deal of diversity in our school and community before handing out samples at the end of the school day. We may ask children to tell us what the bread or spread is called in their native language and any other facts they can recall such as ingredients and when it may be traditionally eaten. We will have a decorative wheatsheaf loaf highlighting the message of harvest.

We would like to ask for food donations too for non-perishable food. Here are the items which are particularly in short supply at this time:

long-life fruit juice, tinned soup, tinned meat, chocolate and sweets, size 6 nappies. The food bank has plenty of baked beans, tea bags and cereal at this time.

School field: The school field is a fantastic resource which is much loved by our children. Occasionally, you may see it being used after hours by ex-HEPS children. If the gate is open on the field it means that they have been given permission to use the field. If the gate is closed and there are no staff cars in the car park, please email the school so we can resolve the situation which may mean asking a member of staff to go to the field.

Tissues: Please send your child in with a little pack of tissues in their bag. If they have a cold, please send in a couple of packs which they can take into the classroom. This is an area where we are trying to encourage and improve independence.

Flu vaccinations: The consent link will close by Thursday 28 September please ensure you have completed this by this date.

Clubs: This week saw most clubs running for the first time; HEPS Harmonies will start next week. Children should attend clubs every week, otherwise their space will be given to a child on the waiting list. If your child is absent from school, or there is another reason they cannot attend for a week, please speak with the School Office or Mrs Doughty Davis.

Safeguarding: A car in the Social Club car park (by the park) was broken into and valuable items taken during morning drop off. Please ensure that you do not leave your children in the car unattended or any other valuable items.

All children must wear a seat belt on all journeys, however short the distance. This is a serious safeguarding breach and could result in a criminal conviction.

Question on the gate: "Will sandwiches still be on the menu in the winter?"

"Yes, the menu choice will still include sandwiches whilst there are a number of children who choose them; they have been very popular this week! The School Council is the group of children who regularly gather the opinions of their peers for the menu and decide what changes may be necessary. We are fortunate that Huish Episcopi Academy, who supply our food, are very keen to listen to feedback and make tweaks where necessary. We are now ordering more school lunches than ever before."
