Safeguarding: Here's an online safety tip. The Facebook Link History Tool tracks all of your browsing history online, no just on Facebook. Facebook then sells your browsing history to advertisers. This may increase your risk of data being lost or mismanaged. Here is how to turn it off: Open the Facebook app, tap 'Menu', 'Settings & Privacy', 'Settings', 'Browser', and toggle off 'Allow link history'.

Question on the gate: "We've heard a lot in the news about school buildings. Is ours OK?"

"With our amazing main building approaching 150 years old, there are always going to be one or two issues.

We are currently trying to remedy ongoing occasional leaks in several places. However, we are in a very good place with our buildings through good monitoring and a great deal of remedial work having taken place in the last six years.

We had a new boiler in the summer which has improved this winter hugely for us all. Almost all of our windows were replaced three years ago. The cabin is only two years old. The radon issue has been resolved through a (costly) filtration system. There have been various amounts of asbestos removed in the past few years. We have completed the redecoration of the site ready to start again! We have been successful in bidding for government funds for several of these projects which has enabled us to bring our site back up to the standards our children and staff deserve. This is an ongoing battle though!

Our children are very respectful of their surroundings and I am sure will look back on their time in this beautiful school with fond memories. It is the same for staff. We know how fortunate we are to come to work in such a historic and inspiring building."
