Safeguarding: Children first see violent online content while still at primary school and describe it as an inevitable part of being online, according to new research

commissioned by Ofcom. All children who took part in the research came across violent content online, mostly via social media, video-sharing and messaging sites and apps. Many told researchers that this is before they have reached the minimum age requirement to use the services.

Violent 18+ gaming content, verbal discrimination and fighting content are commonly encountered by the children they spoke to. Sharing videos of local school and street fights has also become normalised for many of the children. For some, this is because of a desire to build online status among their peers and followers. For others, it is to protect themselves from being labelled as 'different' for not taking part.

As a school we have multiple measures which include regular filtering and testing to ensure children stay safe online whilst in school. We use an online testing system which parents can use too: www.testfiltering.com. This will identify gaps in online protection for children and is free to use.

Question on the gate: "We saw someone from the Department for Education was in school on Thursday, was that Ofsted?"

"Ofsted was not in school on Friday (Ofsted is separate from the Department for Education). However, we are expecting Ofsted within the next year or so as our last inspection was in February 2020. When they visit, we hope you will be able to speak positively of the fantastic educational experience your child/children receive(s), as we all want to feel proud of the school our children attend.

If you feel we are falling short, please don't hesitate to contact us via the School Office so we are able to address your query. In most cases we are able to resolve situations swiftly or at least explain why a situation has occurred or may not be easily resolvable.

Our visitors on Friday were from the Department for Education. We were honoured to be chosen to receive a planned visit which highlighted the work we undertake as a community, school and Trust. We showcased our maths teaching and learning during their visit. Additionally, we spoke of our varied and aspirational curriculum which leads to some of the best progress and attainment results in Somerset and the South West. They were impressed with our beautiful learning environment and the care which is shown. The visitors spoke of the high expectations children have of themselves and their work. The successful HEPS workload strategy was discussed in relation to our diligent staff who support the children in their progress both academically and pastorally. In particular, our visitors were interested in our ways of working, which are notably different from other primary schools. We are hopeful that this visit, and the information gathered, could inform future government guidance which would lead to more children receiving the same high quality educational experience as our children. The children, as always, made us very proud."
