- Implementation pupils develop the skills needed for different competitive sports, with a focus on cognitive, personal, creative, physical, social and health and fitness.
- Impact Pupils develop knowledge and skills across the PE curriculum. They develop resilience, confidence and an independence which leads to a healthy and active lifestyle, helping them to know how to keep physically and mentally healthy as well as having a good understanding of what competitive sport entails.

Year 6 swimming assessment

All of our children are taught a range of swim strokes such as front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke as well as a self-rescue technique. Years 3 and 4 have a weekly swimming lesson for half a term each year. Years 5 and 6 have a weekly swimming lesson for a full term each year. Between February 2020 and December 2022, lessons were cancelled due to the closure of our local pool for COVID. Each child attending HEPS for Years 4-6 would usually receive approximately 40 swimming lessons with HEPS. We strongly encourage parents to support our efforts by taking their children swimming in addition to school lessons to ensure all children swim competently.
